IS: I have taken up leadership positions in the past, and this would be a great opportunity to leverage on my previous skills. I will be a DPhil student here for three years, so I want to take the opportunity to offer something back to the community. From my previous time in Oxford, two years ago, I believe the MCR community can have a great impact, the stronger the community the better, especially during these difficult times. I will focus on bringing in previous expertise, especially interpersonal skills.

VK: What were you doing in Oxford 2 years ago?

LB: It is hard to find a format that gets read, I have written many newsletters that were often ignored, so we have to think about it. I like the idea of message boards and doing more through the website, potentially. Who manages that?

LGBTQIA+ Welfare Officer: Chris Jones

CJ: New to Oxford and Catz. I would like to get involved with the College and the MCR. I would like to promote / increase awareness of LGBTQIA+ issues: especially sexual and mental health services. Next term, February with LGBTQ history month is particularly important. I would like to develop links with the JCR and the OU, which has amazing resources: e.g. Rainbow peers. I think an initiative could be to provide advice and support for individuals that are currently forced to spend a lot of time with family and friends that they are not out to.

CC: Thanks for your nomination, this all sounds great. Just so you know, the previous LGBTQIA+ Officer was very keen on fostering links with the JCR and organised weekly MCR drinks before a night out with the JCR. Would be great to keep that going.

AS: Frazer organised weekly drinks, but it was very alcohol centric. There need to be less alcohol-centric events. Frazer did craft evenings for example, he loved knitting.

CJ: That's very important, we should definitely have activities that are not alcohol-based. It's especially important due to the drinking culture. I look forward to working closely with the Female Welfare Rep.

Female Welfare Officer:

AS: This is my 2nd year at Catz. If you're wondering why the role is called "female" welfare officer? Why are we working under these gender biases? Because I am female, I am looking to take care of people's needs, female and female-identifying. Menstrual health is very important to me. I would like the MCR to provide more bio-degradable products and products in recyclable packages. The JCR can provide menstrual cups and we could do this too. I think university dog walks really help with mental health, I am contact with them and looking forward to organise walks in small groups after lockdown. Consent workshops were missed last year and I think they are key, so I will be working to organise some. I was here for the entire spring and summer lockdown, and I felt left out. Other colleges organised gardening, board games on discord, etc. but I felt abandoned at Catz and I don't want anyone to feel that way. I plan to send a weekly welfare bulletin: explain how to get in touch with peer supporters, etc., make welfare more accessible. As a person from the BAME community, I understand if you feel under-represented, feel far from home, and need a confidant, I will be there.

CC: We did have consent workshops this year - success!

AS: That's fantastic to hear!

VK: Ananya is very enthusiastic, especially with dog-related events. She has been very active in environmental aspects of the College. This was confirmed by NW. The MCR and JCR buy menstrual products directly from the student union, are the menstrual cups from there?

AS: Yes, they are just supplied in smaller quantities.

VK: Do you think that if these are popular, it would be worthwhile to have a small stock of them readily available?

AS: Yes, but we should have them either way.

Romana Meereis

RM: I'm a 1st Year MPhil in Buddhist studies and Sanskrit. I have ideas for different initiatives online that would translate well when lockdown ends: welfare Netflix and chill, meditation on zoom as it translates well over zoom if you have someone leading you. If you have to quarantine and you don't have enough pads, pills, etc. there should be people to help take products to you. I have worked for childline for a long time, used to being in a welfare position. I would like to be an ear, someone to talk to, and can advise about who to talk to.

VK: There is a mindfulness organised by the university and there is yoga provided by college. Do you intend on starting a brand new event for Catz or do you want to collaborate with other colleges?

RM: Depends on what people want to do. If they want larger or more intimate groups, etc.

SS: The mindfulness course is not free and it is quite expensive.

NW: Some medication is only sold under prescription, how would that work?

RM: I can get consent to pick up medication for a student. Case-by-case.

Environment Officer:

NW: I am really pleased to hear from Coco on what to work on at Catz, which are actionable things. I want to focus on: continuing work from last year with the environmental committee. I am committed to improving food sustainability (net zero and sustainable eating that complies with world leading and food research), to being more energy efficient, enabling better energy use and preventing inefficiencies. I would like to increase biodiversity through bird feeders, and also increase awareness of the wildlife we have in our backyards (e.g. badgers, etc.). Seminars would be great to talk about environmental issues, get some scholars in. Started up the environmental committee this year and I am back to working with College.

CS: I am currently studying a master's in archaeology. I want to contribute to the community in any way I can. It is very difficult in the current situation. Eating take-out and wearing disposable masks is not helping. Wearing re-usable masks, using lunch boxes, etc. would be steps to take. Recycling is a very important thing. Different countries have different rules and we need to make things clear about the rules in Oxford. Make a pdf and posters to help people understand their recycling responsibilities and how to fulfil them. I am keen on buying re-usable cups, tote bags, etc. for MCR members. I would like to organise online sessions for people to discuss their thoughts on the environment and how to improve greenness of the MCR and Catz more generally.

AS: Good idea to have a written down set of rules for recyclables. Recommend it being put in all the Catz kitchens. It would be great to collaborate with the Stash reps for tote bags and keep cups.

HA: Re-usable masks would be great.

AS: St Anthony's has them.

SS: ST Anne's: you can buy it. We could that as part of our stash.
