iii. Voting on Elections

4. Motion: Expanding the ballot for Friday guest dinners

Motion proposed by: Michael Hinz

Motion seconded by: Laurence Peinturier

Discussion:

- Michael: There has been complaints about guest dinners seating availability, we had a meeting with College about it; there will be no expansion of seating for now unfortunately. We can only reallocate. One idea is to expand the number of seats in the ballot. Because we have noticed that a lot of people cancel their guest dinner because they could not get their guests in. At the moment, there are 15 seats in the ballot (and 12 when it is an exchange dinner); the goal would be to double these numbers. And we would reduce the number of guests from 3 to 2 just to make sure that people can bring at least 2 guests rather than none. It would also help increase diversity in the people being able to come. And also, it would help release stress to have to be there sharp at 4 pm on Sundays to sign up.
- Ebony: Is this a trial or complete change?
- Michael: Complete change for Hilary and we can re-evaluate at the end of term, and maybe propose another motion if changes need to be made.
- Laurence: When will the motion be effective?
- Michael: Starting HT week 3
- Jeremy: Guest dinners are overly subscribed; we always have double demand every time. We discussed the possibility of adding a second guest dinner in the week, but College said that it would not happen anytime soon.

Motion called to vote: passed with a majority (35 for, 1 abstain)

5. Motion: Furniture Purchases – Motion for Expenses over 1000 pounds

Motion proposed by: Felice Wallner

Motion seconded by: Maximilian Langefeld

Discussion:

- Felice: The MCR was built shortly before the pandemic hit. Then covid hit and College didn't really have time to think about furniture properly. It took quite a while. And changing furniture costs a lot of money. According to constitution, any expense over 1000 pounds needs to be approved during open meeting. Hence why it is important that you guys vote on it. Once we get measurements and design ideas, we'll get back to the MCR with a form to ask for ideas, color choices etc. You will have decision options. And if you want to get even more involved in the decisions, don't hesitate to reach out to us!
- Juan: Do we have an upper budget limit?
- Felice: Basically, it's based on how much we have. There is an upper budget in a sense that we need to be sensible. College will also contribute to a part of the furniture purchase if need be.
- Jeremy: based on previous discussions, up to 15000 pounds is the reasonable amount. Not the entirety will be paid from the MCR account. But we still need to spend our surplus as requested by College. And College is willing to help carry some of the cost.
- Hannah: Will you have the environmental officer involved in the furniture purchase to make it more sustainable?
- Felice: Yes of course, we were actually thinking of going with vegan leather for example.
- Ebony: Will the space be cosier and more Catz specific?
- Felice: Definitely cosier! Cushions, couches, leather style. And something that matches with the wooden doors in the MCR. And we will try to make it more student focused with pictures etc.
- Laurence/Felice: Should we paint the ceiling lol?? 😊

Motion called to vote: passed with a majority (31 for, 5 abstain)

6. Approval of Associate and Honorary MCR Members
